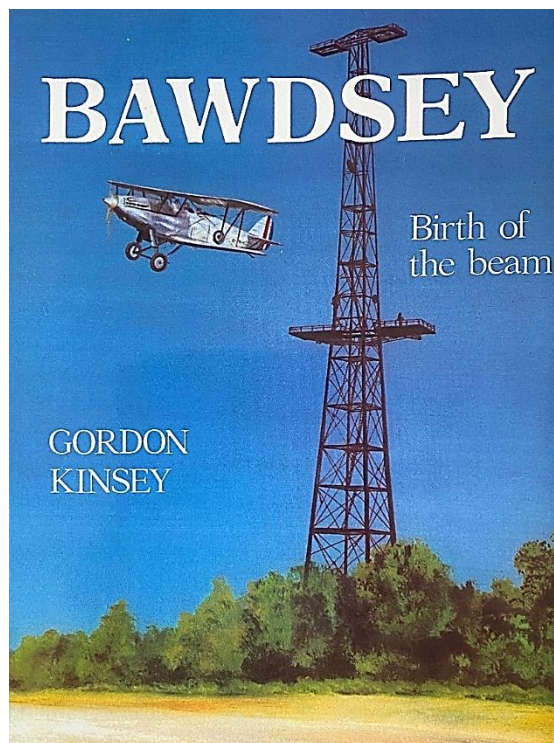

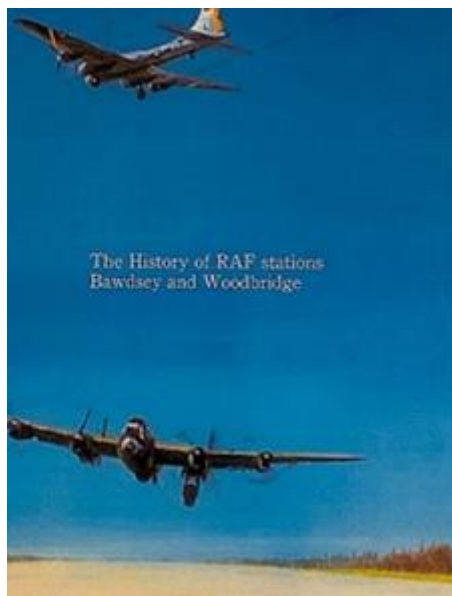

Bawdsey Radar Trust has recently organised a digital reprint of the book by Gordon Kinsey "Bawdsey, Birth of the Beam".

Telling the story of the development of radar at Bawdsey and the work of the "boffins", it also includes tales of life at the RAF station for service personnel and the local folk who were involved.

The narrative goes right up to Bawdsey's role in the Cold war. There is also a chapter on the Quilter family who were the original owners of The Manor before it was bought by the MOD.

Illustrated with many photographs of the time this is the definitive read for anyone interested in the history of radar at Bawdsey.



# THE BAWDSEY RADAR CHRISTMAS CARD

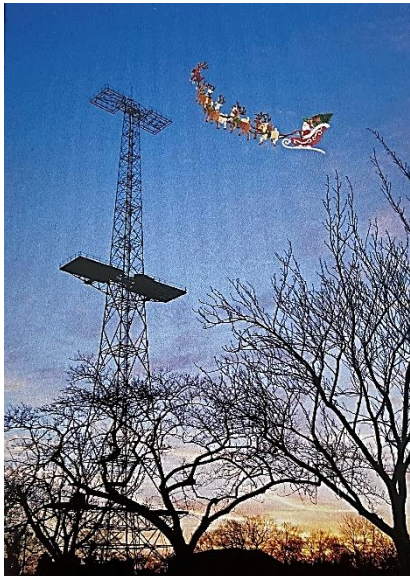

Every purchase actively helps the Trust to maintain the Transmitter Block for future generations and preserve the stories of all those who were part of such an incredible achievement in the development of Radar.



The four Chain Home transmitter towers at Bawdsey were 360ft high. They were made of galvanised steel lattice and had six cantilevered sidearms. Climbing the vertical ladders to the top of these towers for training purposes or repairs was not for the faint hearted, yet aerial erectors and radar fitters were sent to the top on a regular basis. RAF Bawdsey closed in 1991, and the last transmitter tower at Bawdsey was demolished in 2000.

A photograph of the last remaining complete Chain Home transmitter tower appears in the image on the card. Also depicted is a certain Mr S Claus who mistakenly thought he could fly 'under the radar'.

Purchasing this card helps Bawdsey Radar Trust maintain the Transmitter Block and preserve it for future generations.

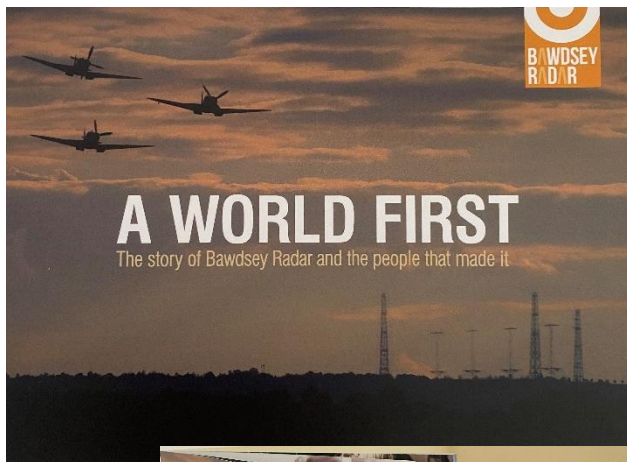

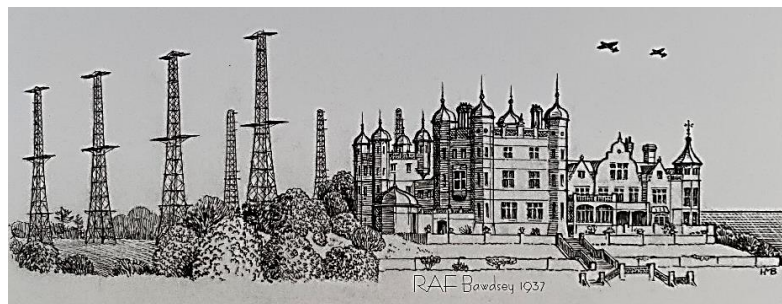


## “RAF BAWDSEY MANOR 1937”

The innovative design on our set of coasters features the famous RAF Sector Clock. During the second world war this clock allowed radar personnel to plot, record and track the movements of both friendly and hostile aircraft. It played a significant role in the Battle of Britain and continued to be used by the RAF until the end of the Cold War. The design on the coaster has been personalised with the RAF Bawdsey insignia, and the time set at 20:18, representing the year 2018 when the Transmitter Block Museum was reopened after its restoration.

This interesting and practical item would make an ideal gift for anyone with an RAF background or interest in WW2 history, or somebody who would enjoy having a small souvenir of RAF Bawdsey

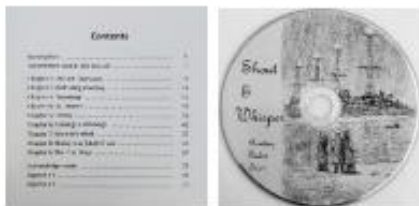
Our “Shout and Whisper” oral history book and CD is one of our best kept secrets. Historically important, we think it is time we started to ‘shout’ about its unique contents!

The idea for the title “Shout and Whisper” was drawn from the massive outgoing radar pulse and the tiny, received echo.

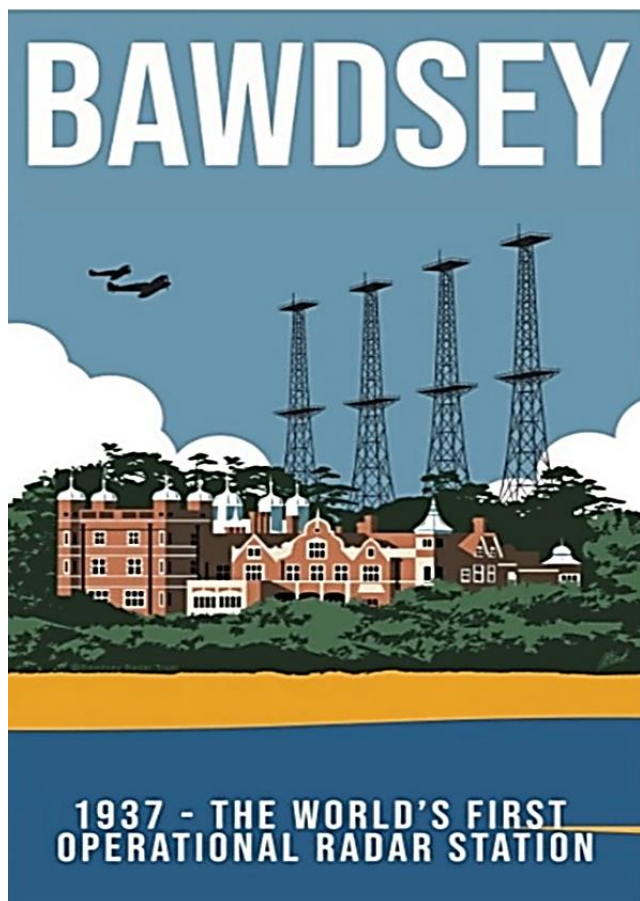
